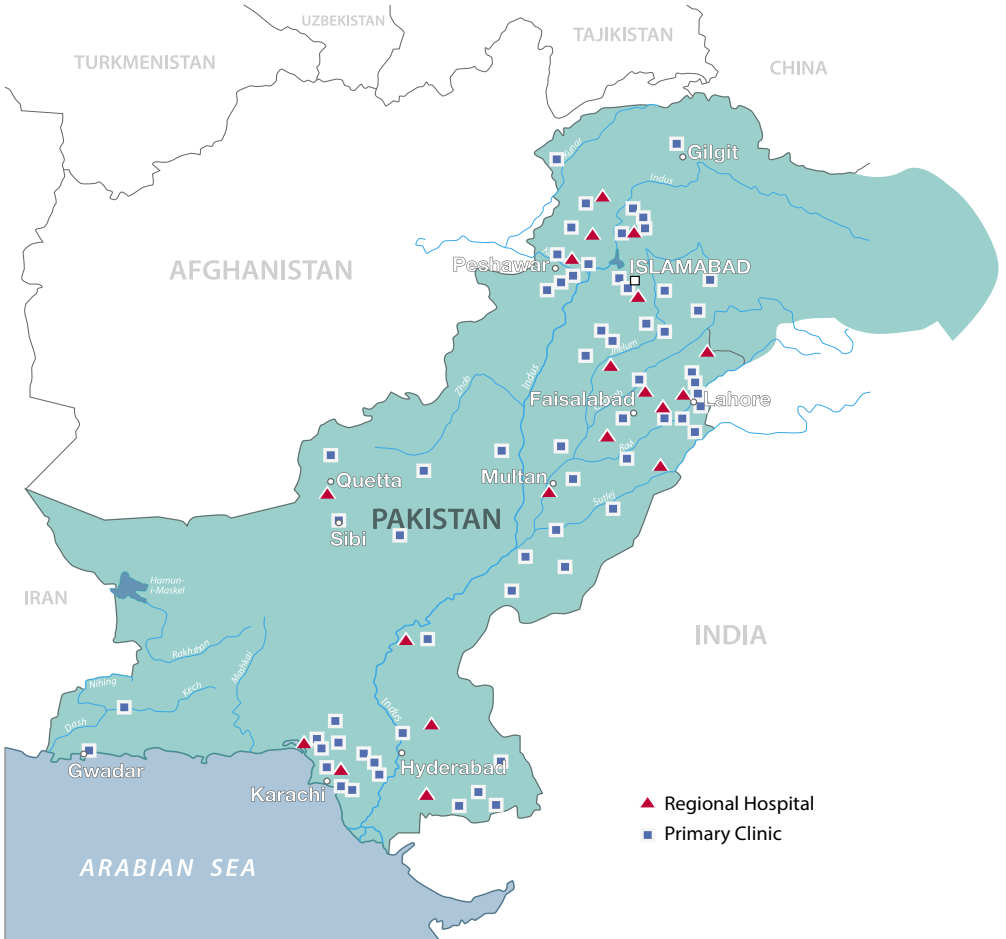

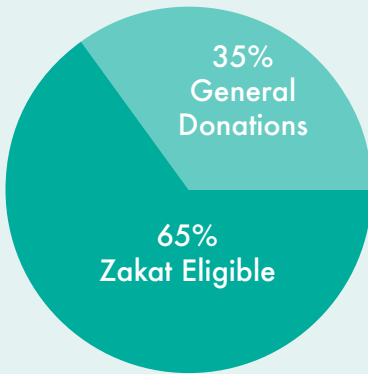
How your donations were spent in 2022

3,115,669 patients treated during 2022

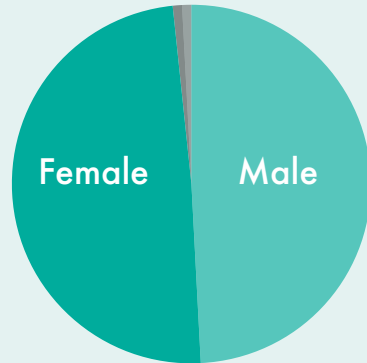
Zakat, Sadaqah and General Donations are vital to ensure that we can treat everyone regardless of gender, caste, ethnicity, religion, race or sect.

What we did in 2022

Flood Relief - 100 mobile health camps, 45,000 people treated

Mobile eye camps were re-purposed to provide medical aid for those in the worst affected areas in Pakistan. Our teams of medics treated people suffering from water borne diseases such as cholera, dysentery, malaria, dengue and eye and skin infections. We also provided clean water and food for communities in desperate need.

Mental Health Programme

Our mental health programme in partnership with the Lady Fatima Trust has provided pioneering free counselling services to 100 patients to help them cope with chronic eye conditions.

New Hospital Under Construction in Punjab

Construction began in June on our 20th new hospital at Rahim Yar Khan. When completed in 2024, the hospital will treat 300 patients daily. Currently, the nearest eye hospital is over 100 miles away.

Eye Health in Africa – Sharing Expertise

A sponsored team of highly qualified and experienced surgeons from LRBT visited Niger and Gambia to run mobile eye camps, perform cataract surgeries and train local doctors.

Training Doctors at LRBT

50 doctors enrolled on our postgraduate fellowship programme at our **3 teaching hospitals**

44 candidates training at our School of Paramedicine to qualify as:

- **Operating Theatre Technicians**
- **Refractionists**
- **Ophthalmic Technicians**

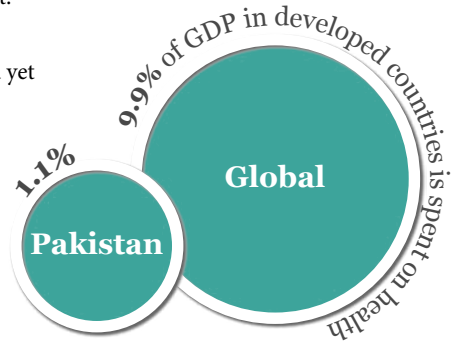
The Year Ahead

We require £10m per year to run our network of hospitals and clinics.

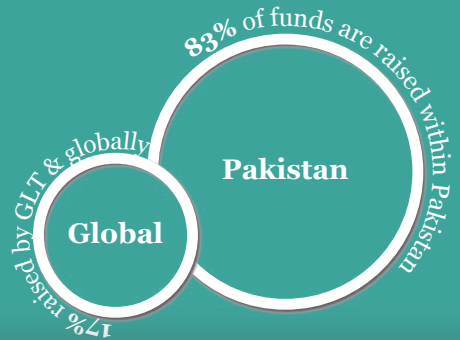
We expect to see patient numbers increase by at least 10% this year as patients who deferred treatment due to the pandemic now seek treatment.
